



Ultimate Garage Decluttering Checklist

Step 1: Preparation

✔ Set a Goal & Schedule Time

✔ Gather Supplies

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Step 2: Empty the Garage

✔ Remove **everything** from the garage and place it outside or in the driveway.

✔ Group items by category:

- Tools
- Sports & outdoor gear
- Holiday & seasonal decorations

- Automotive supplies
- Home improvement materials
- Gardening supplies
- Household overflow storage (extra paper towels, light bulbs, etc.)

✔ This allows you to see everything you have and make better decisions.

Step 3: Declutter & Sort

✔ Create Sorting Zones

- **KEEP** (items you use regularly and need)
- **DONATE** (gently used items someone else could use)
- **TRASH** (broken, outdated, or unusable items)
- **RELOCATE** (items that don't belong in the garage)

- Do I have duplicates?
- Would I buy this again today?
- Could someone else use this more than I do?

✔ Dispose of Hazardous Materials Properly

- Old paint, motor oil, batteries, and chemicals need special disposal.
- Check your local waste disposal site for drop-off guidelines.

✔ Declutter with Purpose

Ask yourself:

- Do I use this regularly?
- Is it broken, expired, or outdated?

✔ Let Go of Sentimental Clutter

- If items hold memories but not usefulness, take a photo before donating.

Step 4: Organizing & Storage Solutions

✔ Use Clear, Labeled Storage Bins

- Keeps items visible and protected from dust.
- Stack bins to maximize space.

✔ Install Shelving & Wall Storage

- Use vertical space with shelves or cabinets.
- Pegboards or wall hooks for tools, bikes, and garden equipment.

✔ Create Designated Zones

- Group similar items together:
 - **Tools & Hardware** near workbenches
 - **Seasonal Items** in harder-to-reach spots

- **Everyday Items** (sports gear, pet supplies) within easy reach

✔ Use Overhead Storage

- Store infrequently used items (holiday decor, camping gear) in ceiling-mounted racks.

✔ Keep the Floor Clear

- Use shelving and hooks to keep items off the ground for easier cleaning and access.

✔ Organize Small Items

- Use clear plastic drawers for nails, screws, and small tools.
- Magnetic strips can hold metal tools for quick access.
